



A multi-storeyed housing catering to approximately 500 households was the given requirement. Freedom was given to design the units and their massing in any way possible until it fills all the requirements, with the height restriction of 60M. Rather than going in the direction of a high-rise building, the thought was to do something innovative, which helps us maintain the quality of life in the bungalows or 'kothis' of the area.

Therefore, it was decided to create a housing which makes it worthwhile for the residence to spent more than half of their day here. Using pre-fabricated modules not only helps aid our design, but also would decrease the required time, man-power and would be economical for long term.




FORM DEVELOPMENT


Khuri is a small village which is about 40 kms southwest of Jaisalmer – an hour and a world away from the fort's swarming tradelt belongs to Jodhpur Division. Khuri has its own desert sand dunes, and it remains a peaceful place apart from during holiday periods, as it's popular with Indian holidaymakers, with houses of mud and straw which are decorated like the patterns on Persian carpets. There are abundance of camps of mud huts, and camel drivers who are eager to take you on the dunes, but no shop-lined streets or pancake restaurants. Once the excitement of sunset is over, there is desert solitude and the brilliant star-studded sky at night to look forward to.

Keeping this in mind, is a centre for the villagers, by the villagers, of the villagers designed in Khuri, near Jaisalmer in Rajasthan. Still drowned in the backward thinking, the programme aims to help the women of the village gain expertise in vocational subjects, represent themselves on national and international levels and be an earning member of the family. Some traditions would remain the same while the others will change, but slowly so as not to recieve repulsion from the other side. This programme not only provodes learning opportunities for women, but also for men as they learn to accept and support the change taking place within the village socio-economic structure. In order to not make this progress monotonous, there will be a change in the courses semi-anually, making more and more families interested in the same. Over the time, change will be reflected on a much larger scale, in turn helping the village grow on many aspects and setting an example for the other villages to follow.

The design is spread across the village, rather than concentrated in one region, to make it more accessible and easire for the women to come. For better functioning, the nodal points and the central area are co-related with each other as well.


Spread across the village are three nodal points which act as an initiation for the programme anticipated. These nodes are designed in a spiral form so as to maintain the traditional parda system for the female users, as well as help them become proficient in their area of vocational expertise. This will not make the traditional families apprehensive of sending their females here as these learning spaces would be situated in close vicinity of their homes, along with which these women will be able to stand on their own and help in the financial status of their homes.

The design elements are rooted from the Gadisagar Temple, situated near the vilage which is a great tourist attraction in itself. Such as the chattri, these vernacular elements help the women feel at home and comfortable, while in a foreign place. Smaller Activities like gathering, learning craft, spreading awareness etc. can take place.





The main site helps them transcend from a local home taker to a cultural artisan on a scale beyong their imagination.

Here, not only females learn to support themselves and cut out of the traditional parda system prevelent back at their homes but also the men learn on how to apperciate the success of the women of their village and push them to achieve grater heights. This centrally located space can also become a hub of cultural and commercial activities, helping it attract tourists, especially from Jaisalmer, hence helping the economy of the village indirectly.









Preservation Pods for Suspended Animation



Clusters of Pods arranged at different levels of skyscrapper




Vertical Circulation connecting the surface to the skyscraper




Energy Generation through Turbines opening at the sea, and Geothermal through earth



The design brief tasked us with creating a tote bag that reflects the essence of our people. To begin the design process, we carefully considered the purpose and usage of the product. As a daily accessory, the tote needed to be practical and suitable for regular use. It was crucial to strike a balance between simplicity and functionality, avoiding excessive embellishments that may diminish its aesthetic appeal over time.

Since the tote also serves as a fashion accessory, versatility was a key consideration. We aimed to create a design that seamlessly complements any outfit the user chooses to wear. Our approach involved incorporating a discreet bill design on one end of the tote. At first glance, it may not draw much attention, but upon closer inspection, the personalized text becomes visible, representing the people and the college.

In addition, we integrated elements that pay homage to our architectural background, adding a touch of uniqueness to the design. Furthermore, we included tags where users can personalize their tote by writing their own information, enhancing its personalized appeal.







A sculptural furniture piece was created to serve both as a functional unit and a work of art within the studio space. The objective was to provide a dedicated display area for students to showcase their architectural models and other works, addressing the current issue of scattered displays throughout the college. To achieve this, a display unit was designed using waste concrete blocks and reinforced with on-site architectural materials.

The choice of concrete was deliberate, aiming to create a visually pleasing unit that would seamlessly blend with the studio environment and enhance the items placed on it. The sculpture was conceptualized to be a subtle yet impactful entity, adding an artistic touch to the studio setting. During the execution phase, the blocks were carefully assembled in a unique composition that considered human anthropometrics, and ensuring comfortable interaction with the unit. Despite the limited space, multiple utility areas were integrated into the design, maximizing functionality.

This sculptural furniture piece not only fulfils the need for display space but also adds an aesthetic element to the studio. It exemplifies the creative use of materials and the thoughtful consideration of user experience. By repurposing waste concrete blocks and incorporating design principles, the result is a visually striking and functional addition to the studio environment.















In the end, it's about embracing new ideas, challenging preconceived notions, developing a deeper understanding of architecture and bringing fresh and exciting ideas to the table.








Red Storm

But this time, was there a difference, a meaning, a hidden message, that I missed home, while living in it, cause the walls around me, remained the same, but the souls, did not.




Left/Right

All of this, was caught by my eye, while stopping, for a 10 second red light.




